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"The trajectory for rates this year is downward, and we expected the road to be bumpy, but this road is covered in potholes, speed bumps and has very little clear signage." EHF Mortgages' Justin Moy said: "Another sad start to the week, with more rate increases this time from Santander, and likely to trigger similar activity with other High Street lenders.

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"It's unlikely that low inflation will kick start cheaper mortgages, a complete lack of fiscal focus and a 'let it happen' attitude from the Government are slowly eroding the property and mortgage markets to a complete standstill. Sorry borrowers, no easy way out of this at the moment."

Lifetime Wealth's Katy Eatenton said: "Monday mornings are starting to be the bearer of bad news, last week saw rises across the board and this week is no different. Santander are the last of the high street lenders to make rises, but I'm sure it won't be the last for this week! All eyes will be on the next Bank of England announcement on May 9th and the inflation announcement on May

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
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
